

Information for 2020 Alcathon

The 2020 Alcathon is scheduled to take place this year with a revised schedule and some rules, guidelines and procedures in place.

The doors will open at 2:00pm on 12/31/20. Meetings will start at 4:00pm. They will be 45 minutes in length so the meeting rooms, chairs, tables, door knobs, railings, etc. can be disinfected after each and every meeting. The last meeting will start at midnight and run until 1:00am!

Everyone will be **REQUIRED** to wear a face covering. If you do not have a face covering, we will provide you with a disposable mask at the door. Please understand that Atonement is graciously allowing us to rent the building for our event. While it is our event, it is very much their building and we must respect their rules and requirements. The wearing of face coverings is done to protect each other.... I wear my mask to protect you..... please wear yours to protect me. Anyone NOT wearing a face covering will be asked to put one on or leave the building. If you are unable to wear a face covering please do not enter the building. This is not meant to offend anyone but it has to be this way for the safety of all of us.

To make this fun! -There will be a Mask/Face covering contest. There will be a winner announced at every meeting. (the prizes will be donated by the Unity Chair-no prizes will be bought with money from the Alcathon budget). Pizzaz, bedazzle, decorate, etc. your face covering and wear it bold and proud! Winners will be chosen at the end of every hourly meeting.

There will be hand sanitizer, disinfecting wipes, paper towels and cleaning sprays available if you feel the need to use them, please do.

There will also be a game room!! We are planning on having games that do not require a lot of hands-on to play, which will keep it as safe as possible. Any items that must be touched will be cleaned.

Please stay tuned for more information. Some of the plans may need to be adjusted when we see what guidelines are in place in December. That's ok.....
