The meetings have gone from speaker meetings to discussion meetings. I have gotten to know these guys and help some of them transition into AA outside the prison. Talk about a blessing. I look forward to going to the prison every Monday and the guys look forward to seeing me. They know there is a place to go if they want help and more so they know that there are people who really do care when it seems like everyone else has written them off. As a result of AA I get to be a light up ahead for those who only saw darkness.
