- I am reviewing our Hotline expenses and investigating other less expensive options. Working with Hotline Bill. Three expenses for our hotline:
 - Verizon call forwarding phone line, 2 listings in the white pages, the actual calls, and taxes and surcharges. \$50-55/mo
 - ATM Advantage Telemessaging answer hotline and give website for meeting times, or call list of volunteers, or email Bill M. Since 1999, grandfather rate since 2007. \$75-100 over last 3 months
 - Hibu (fka Yellowbook) search engine mobilizer for searches on google from cell phones. Working with the website servant Steve because there may be redundancy and this costs \$49 per month.
- I am also working with other IG chairpersons I met at NERAASA to learn how they handle their hotline and what carriers they use. More to be revealed.
- New pamphlet 2022 Membership Survey published 2023 by World Services. Surveyed over 6,000 members of AA. Answers questions like "what got you here?" AA member or on their own, treatment facility. Length of sobriety? What keeps you here? What Additional help therapy, Healthcare. Types of meetings in person, zoom, hybrid? Sponsorship how quickly got one? What % has one? Largest age group is 51-61, etc.. Fascinating
